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ALBERTA PACKARDS

Packard Motor Car Company of Detroit, Michigan (1899-1958), began before the turn of the 20th century. It produced some of the finest automobiles available. These were owned by royalty, the Hollywood elite and the upper crust of society. As the depression deepened, less expensive cars (but still costly in comparison to the average Ford, Chev or Dodge) were developed which helped ensure Packard's continued operations unlike many of it's competitors including Stutz, Pearce Arrow and Peerless.

Packard was known as "master motor builders". Early in their history they also produced airplanes and airplane engines and heavy duty vehicles such as trucks and buses.

Some Packard automotive industry firsts include:

- 1900: the H-pattern gear shift arrangement
- 1901: the use of the steering wheel instead of a tiller
- 1915: a mass-produced V12 powered automobile
- 1923: hypoid differential gears allowing a lower floor
 - 1942: air conditioning as an option
- 1950: the only independent automobile company to engineer and manufacture their own automatic transmission
- 1955: 4-wheel torsion bar suspension with automatic leveling
